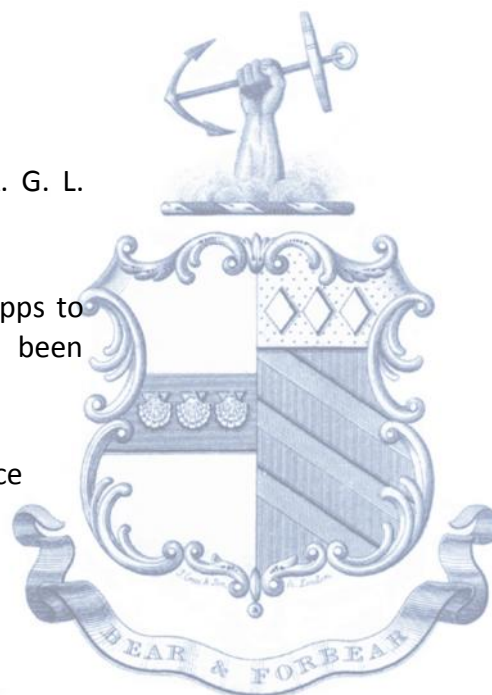


## Gipps-La Trobe Correspondence

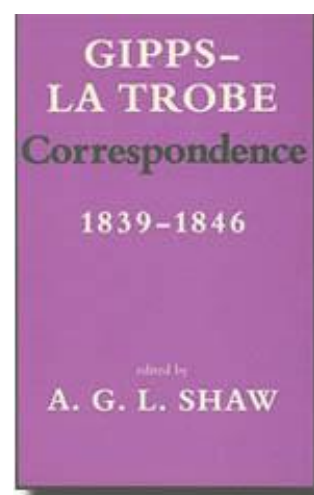
*Gipps-La Trobe Correspondence, 1839-1846*, edited by A. G. L. Shaw. Melbourne, The Miegunyah Press, 1989.
