### Visit to Black Rock House - 20 February

The Friends of Black Rock House have invited us to a special tour on Saturday 20 February at 2pm. This 1856 property was first built as a holiday residence for Victoria's first Auditor-General Charles Ebden. Governor Sir Henry Barkly used the house as a vice-regal retreat between 1861 and 1863. Black Rock House, 34 Ebden Avenue, Black Rock is included in the Victorian Heritage Register, the register of the national estate and is classified by the National Trust.
